DAYS 0-1: BUENOS AIRES

Arrive in Argentina's handsome and sophisticated capital and transfer to your included stay at the Alvear Icon hotel (or similar) for an overnight.

DAY 1: USHUAIA

Transfer to the airport for your **included** flight to Ushuaia. Nestled in a bowl of snowcapped mountains on the banks of the Beagle Channel, Ushuaia greets you with a tapestry of colorful houses scattered against a rim of dramatic



jagged peaks. It is often referred to as El Fin del Mundo, the "end of the world." and it is the de facto gateway to Antarctica, where you will embark for

your expedition to the Great White Continent.

DAYS 2-3: DRAKE PASSAGE

Your Antarctic voyage truly begins as you cross the Drake Passage, the strait separating South America from Antarctica. These waters are rich in plankton and krill, attracting a wide variety of marine life. Your Expedition Team will point out the noticeable change to Antarctic waters and identify ever-present petrels on the waves, albatrosses gliding just above the sea, and the exciting appearance of any whales or dolphins.

DAYS 4-8: THE ANTARCTIC EXPERIENCE

You will never forget your first sighting of Antarctica and its islands. Regardless of weather conditions, you will find yourself spellbound by the vision of a completely unspoiled landscape of ice, rock, and ink-blue sea. During your time on the Great White Continent, your Captain and Expedition Leader plan your itinerary, daily landings, scenic cruising, and exploration operations to offer you the widest variety of experiences possible based on conditions and wildlife reports. The numbers and concentrations of wildlife thriving in Antarctica must be seen

to be believed. Your every waking hour is punctuated with visits to breeding colonies of different penguin species; sightings of crabeater, Weddell, and leopard seals basking on ice or



swimming; and watching various species of whales feeding, breaching, or passing in view. Petrels, skuas, gulls, and other seabirds fill the skies. And inspiring, panoramic views of mountain ranges, glaciers, and sculpted icebergs lend a dreamlike quality to every hour. Antarctica has been a source of inspiration for as long as humans have been aware of its existence. For these five days, you are privileged to experience this truly wild place at a level of luxury previously unimaginable.



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DAYS 9-10: DRAKE PASSAGE

Relax on another crossing of the **Drake Passage.** You may share tales of your personal explorations with shipmates, some of whom may become lifelong friends. Expedition Team members are

may become lifelong friends. Expedition Team members are once again available to point out birds and any marine life as you sail northward.

DAY 11: USHUAIA & BUENOS AIRES

Monte Olivia towers above **Ushuaia**, Argentina, as you approach from the Beagle Channel. You have returned to one of the southernmost cities on Earth and re-entered civilization. Today you will disembark and transfer to the airport for your **included return flight to Buenos Aires.** But for the rest of your life you may occasionally experience an emotional lift simply recalling that such a place as Antarctica exists.





HIGHLIGHT: CHINSTRAP PENGUINS. Feisty little chinstraps are named for the distinctive band running from a black "helmet" atop the head to under the neck. They stand about 30 inches (76 cm) high and make circular nests of (much disputed over) stones. They feed on krill, small fish, and squid, often at great distances from shore.

DAYS 0-2: PUNTARENAS (PUERTO CALDERA) & AT SEA

Meet your ship and Expedition Team in **Puerto Caldera**, nestled between the volcanic beaches of Golfo de Nicoya and some of the highest mountains in Costa Rica. Your Expedition Team will travel with you throughout your voyage and will be on hand to identify the migratory sea birds and marine mammals you spot during days at sea.

DAYS 3-4: MANTA (QUITO) & AT SEA

Choose from two intriguing, included excursions. Learn the secrets behind the



creation of Panama hats, which originated not far from here in the small colonial village of Montecristi. Making them is an ancient skill that has been

recognized by UNESCO as an Intangible Cultural Heritage art form. Or, visit the Pacoche Wildlife Refuge to search for howler monkeys, orchids, and toucans.

DAYS 5-6: SALAVERRY (TRUJILLO) & ISLA GUAÑAPE

Pastel-colored colonial mansions with attractive grillwork greet you in **Trujillo.** This area is known for its archaeological sites and on included excursions you can



visit the ancient Chimu capital of Chan Chan, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, or El Brujo, where you can see pyramids built by the Mochican culture. Or take an optional excursion to legendary Machu Picchu, the 15th-century Inca citadel. Next up is **Isla Guañape**, a place rich in birdlife and marine wildlife. Join your Expedition Team on Zodiac[®] boats or an optional kayak excursion to explore these rarely visited offshore islands.

DAYS 7-9: CALLAO (LIMA), & AT SEA

Lima, the City of Kings, was the jewel of the Spanish Empire in South America. During our overnight stay, you can explore the handsome old colonial buildings surrounding the Plaza de Armas, feast your eyes on gold and silver artifacts, and gain insights into more than 5,000 years of Peruvian history.

DAY 10: PUNTA ISLAY & MATARANI (AREQUIPA)

Start the day with a Zodiac expedition to **Punta Islay** and the other islands surrounding **Matarani.** Inca terns and Humboldt penguins are often here in large numbers, and you may also see marine otters, eared seals, sea lions, and fur seals. Next, head to Arequipa, whose historic center is a UNESCO World Heritage Site with colonial buildings made mostly of white lava rock. Or opt for Mejia National Sanctuary with its 1,700 acres of wetlands and 141 bird species, including the rare Chilean flamingo.

DAYS 11-12: AT SEA & ANTOFAGASTA

Following a day at sea, arrive in **Antofagasta**, a busy port by the Atacama Desert. This region is known for its mining. In the old days it was for silver



and saltpeter, used to make gunpowder. Today it's more about copper and lithium. These resources have attracted foreign investment over the years, and the city has a bit of a European feel with some attractive Victorian buildings. Your included tour shows off highlights like the Clock Tower, the Old Customs House, and the former Railway Station.

DAYS 13-14: AT SEA & ISLA CHOROS

Take advantage of a day at sea to recharge with a relaxing visit to your ship's spa before arriving at **Isla Choros.** This tiny island off the Chilean coast is part of the Reserva Nacional Pingüino de Humboldt, and as you might guess, it's home to Humboldt penguins as well as numerous other bird species. Board a Zodiac with your Expedition Team for a cruise around the island, pausing to admire penguins, red-legged cormorants, Peruvian diving petrels, and more. Or get even closer on an optional kayak excursion as you paddle near the island, keeping your eyes peeled for the bottlenose dolphins that are often found in these waters.

DAYS 14-15: COQUIMBO (LA SERENA)

Arriving in the early evening for an overnight gives you a full day to explore the twin cities of **Coquimbo** and **La Serena.** La Serena was founded in 1544 and still boasts many beautiful Spanish colonial and neocolonial buildings such as the stone cathedral presiding over the Plaza de Armas. Coquimbo is the source of legends about pirates and hidden treasure. Learn about this fascinating past on your included tour, then spend some free time browsing the alpaca wool products and other handicrafts at La Recova Market.





DAY 16: SAN ANTONIO (SANTIAGO)

Your expedition ends in **Santiago**, a city with Spanish colonial charm and a vivacious spirit. If you have time before your departure, colorful Valparaíso and the seaside resort of Viña del Mar are nearby, as are some of Chile's most famous wineries.

DAYS 0-1: REYKJAVÍK

Arrive in the charming Nordic capital of **Reykjavík** and transfer to the Iceland Parliament Hotel (or similar) for your included overnight hotel stay.

DAY 1: KANGERLUSSUAQ

Head to the airport for your **included flight to Kangerlussuaq** in western



Greenland. With the end of a long fjord on one side and the Greenland ice sheet on the other, this city is home to the country's largest commercial airport.

DAY 2: SISIMIUT

The second-largest city in Greenland, **Sisimiut** is sustained by its fishing industry, with cod, shrimp, salmon, and halibut being the predominant species. Make sure to visit the lovely museum, housed in historical buildings from the Danish colonization period, and explore its blue church, the best-preserved historic church in Greenland.

DAY 3: ILULISSAT

Named for the Greenlandic word for iceberg, **Ilulissat** sits at the end of the Jacobshavn (Sermeq Kujalleq) Glacier fjord. Witness the incredible icebergs that have come 25 miles from the face of the glacier and out to sea. In the nearby Sermermiut Valley, the new Icefjord Centre blends the importance of the ice with the human history of the region, which dates back more than 4,000 years.

DAY 4: KARRAT FJORD

Located far north in western Greenland, the fishing village of **Karrat Fjord** was partially destroyed in 2017 after a massive landslide caused one of the tallest tsunamis ever recorded. You'll explore the region by Zodiac[®] and kayak, and you may even get the opportunity to land ashore and hike or walk the beautiful tundra landscape.

DAY 5: DAY AT SEA: BAFFIN BAY

On your relaxing sea day, join the Expedition Team on deck to look for migratory sea birds and marine mammals in the nutrient-rich waters. Or,





visit the Bow Lounge to enhance your understanding of the ship's navigation systems and view the digital charts.

DAY 6: POND INLET, NUNAVUT

Arrive on the north end of Baffin Island at the community of **Pond Inlet, Nunavut,** one of the region's most interesting and welcoming communities. Local Inuit residents will guide you on a walk through town and answer questions



about what it's like to live in such a remote location. You'll also visit the community center to learn more about the residents and view local handicrafts.

DAY 7: DEVON ISLAND, DUNDAS HARBOUR & CROKER BAY



On **Devon Island,** spend the morning at **Dundas Harbour,** site of a former post for the RCMP. See the remains of the old outpost, explore the hardy tundra flora, watch for wildlife, and visit stone home sites that were long ago inhabited by the Thule people. In the afternoon, visit **Croker Bay** to see the tidewater glacier at its head. This region is a breeding site for seabirds, and seals and walruses are often sighted here.

DAYS 8-17: NORTHWEST PASSAGE

To sail through the famed **Northwest Passage** is to accomplish something many people spent centuries searching and striving for. Your activities here will be flexible, as the ice determines where and how we proceed, but this is a wonderland of rugged tundra, historical remains, modern Inuit communities, and sea ice that is essential habitat for most local animals. Explore this area by Zodiac, kayak, and submarine, using your ship as a home base to experience the wild passages of the North.

DAYS 18-21: DAYS AT SEA: BEAUFORT & CHUKCHI SEAS

Upon exiting the narrow channels of the Northwest Passage, you'll sail the **Beaufort Sea**, across the top of Canada's Northwest Territories and Yukon. Join the Expedition Team on deck to watch for seabirds and marine mammals or visit the Discovery Center for more information about the unique species that call this region home.

DAYS 22-23: NOME & ANCHORAGE

Today, disembark in **Nome, Alaska**, which was made suddenly famous when gold was discovered here in 1898. After a short exploration, transfer to the airport for your **included charter flight to Anchorage.** Upon arrival, head to your hotel, Hotel Captain Cook (or similar), to reflect on your fascinating journey during your included overnight.

12-DAY LANDS OF THE CELTS

GREENWICH (LONDON) TO LEITH (EDINBURGH) | MAY 12, 2023 | SEABOURN VENTURE

DAYS 0-1: GREENWICH (LONDON) & AT SEA

Welcome to London's Borough of **Greenwich,** a portion of which is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Set the stage for your coming voyage with a visit to the National Maritime Museum or the lovely museum ships on the riverfront.

DAY 2: ST. MARY'S (TRESCO), ISLES OF SCILLY

While the Star Castle and Marconi's telegraph tower are impressive, it's Tresco Abbey Garden that grabs the attention. Thanks to the mild climate, the gardens



are home to plants that wouldn't survive anywhere else in the U.K. The island also holds a treasure trove of wildlife including puffins, seals, Manx shearwaters, rare dragonflies, and seabirds such as shags and guillemots. Watch for them on an optional kayak expedition.

DAY 3: DUBLIN

The bridges, waterways, and Georgian architecture of Ireland's capital are enchanting and beautiful, as is imposing **Dublin** Castle. The moody atmosphere most likely contributed to its UNESCO designation as a city of literature. Revisit the favorite haunts of writers like Oscar Wilde, James Joyce, and W.B. Yeats on an included excursion. Or, explore the scenic and historic River Liffey by kayak on an optional expedition.

DAY 4: CALF OF MAN & PEEL, ISLE OF MAN

Tiny **Calf of Man** is home to breeding populations of 33 seabird species. Head out on a Zodiac[®] with your Expedition Team to enjoy the feathered show and views of the beautiful cliffs and lighthouse. In **Peel,** admire buildings made of reddish sandstone, many of which were once original homes and businesses of fishermen and merchants.

DAY 5: RATHLIN ISLAND & PORT ELLEN, ISLE OF ISLAY

Rathlin Island hosts Northern Ireland's largest seabird colony, including three of its rarest breeding birds: the chough, great skua, and twite. This is also an ideal place to spot raptors soaring and diving down for a meal. On the **Isle of Islay**, check out

world-renowned whisky distilleries, most of which use traditional processes like hand-cut peat.

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DAY 6: BAILE MÒR, IONA & STAFFA

Saint Columba arrived on **Iona** in 563 AD and quickly set about converting pagans to the Christian faith. Iona became known as a missionary center, and over the centuries the monks produced countless elaborate carvings, manuscripts, and Celtic crosses. Perhaps their greatest work was the exquisite *Book of Kells*, currently on display in Dublin's Trinity College. Enjoy a view into "The Musical Cave" during an included Zodiac cruise around **Staffa**, an island made up completely of vertical basalt towers.



DAY 7: TOBERMORY, ISLE OF MULL & LUNGA, TRESHNISH ISLES

Tobermory is one of the prettiest port towns in Scotland. An optional kayak expedition lets you enjoy the peaceful environment at its best. Uninhabited **Lunga** is a sanctuary and breeding site for seabirds. Take a Zodiac or kayak along the coast to observe the abundant birdlife, maybe even comical Atlantic puffins.

DAY 8: AM BAILE, ST. KILDA

The entire archipelago of **St. Kilda** is owned by the National Trust for Scotland and is one of the few UNESCO World Heritage sites chosen for both its natural and cultural qualities. Its cliffs are nesting grounds for vast populations of seabirds, but it's equally famous for its human history. A community existed here at least 4,000 years ago, leaving behind stone huts as well as two ancient sheep species that still thrive.

DAY 9: STORNOWAY, ISLE OF LEWIS & SHIANT ISLANDS

Standing stones and pottery shards at least 5,000 years old are evidence of occupants who lived on the **Isle of Lewis** long before the Vikings. Described as Scotland's Stonehenge, the Callanish Standing Stones are set on a peninsula jutting into a loch – just one of the sights you'll see on your included excursion. The day includes a rare call to the uninhabited **Shiant Islands,** one of the most important breeding colonies for seabirds in Europe.



DAY 10: KIRKWALL, ORKNEY ISLANDS

Step back to Neolithic times on a tour of the Ring of Brodgar and Skara Brae. This area is among the most important Neolithic sites in Western Europe, and Skara Brae has been called the "Scottish Pompeii" for its excellent preservation. Save your evening for an optional excursion to an Orcadian Ceilidh (kay-lee), a party filled with music and dancing.

DAY 11: COPINSAY, ORKNEY ISLANDS

Human residents left **Copinsay** in 1958, but seabird colonies still call it home. Protected by the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds, kittiwakes, fulmars, guillemots, razorbills, and others nest here. On an optional kayak expedition, you may even spot a local colony of grey seals.

DAY 12: LEITH (EDINBURGH)

Edinburgh's Old Town and New Town together form a UNESCO World Heritage Site filled with rich historic treasures like magnificent Edinburgh Castle. Take in the highlights on an optional tour before heading to the airport and home.



15-DAY GREENLAND & ICELAND: VIKINGS & VOLCANOES

DAYS 0-2: REYKJAVÍK, KANGERLUSSUAQ & AT SEA 🛪

Arrive in **Reykjavík** and transfer to the Iceland Parliament Hotel (or similar) for your included overnight hotel stay. In the morning, head to the airport for an included flight to **Kangerlussuaq** where your expedition voyage begins. Kangerlussuaq is home to just 500 residents, but has Greenland's most diverse terrestrial fauna including muskoxen, caribou, and gyrfalcons.

DAY 3: NUUK

Greenland's capital, **Nuuk**, is the country's largest city, yet has fewer than 20,000 residents. Enjoy views of the Nuuk Fjord system, the second largest in the world, and visit the Greenland National Museum and Archives for a look at the country's

history from the Arctic Stone Age to the present. If you're feeling adventurous, try an optional stand-up paddleboard excursion in the Nuuk Fjord.

DAYS 4-5: PAAMIUT, QAQORTOQ & HVALSEY

The tiny town of **Paamiut** is home to Greenland's largest population of white-tailed eagles, so keep an eye overhead. An optional expedition by submarine lets you explore the small islands scattered near town. In **Qaqortoq,** watch one of the local expert kayakers show you what kayaks can really do. Inuits are credited with inventing the kayak thousands of years ago, so they've had plenty of practice. Just 12 miles further up the fjord, you'll find one of the most prominent Norse archaeological sites in Greenland, the so-called "Eastern Settlement" at **Hvalsey.**



DAYS 6-7: BRATTAHLÍÐ, TUNULLIARFIK FJORD, TASERMIUT FJORD & NANORTALIK

Leif Erikson set sail from here on a voyage that landed him in North America. Visit the Norse ruins of **Brattahlíð** and Garðar, both part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Enjoy the serene beauty of **Tunulliarfik Fjord**, and take a spectacular Zodiac[®] cruise through **Tasermiut Fjord**, known for its dramatic mountains. In picturesque **Nanortalik**, houses are painted in cheery colors and seals lounge on icebergs offshore.

DAY 8: SCENIC CRUISING PRINCE CHRISTIAN SUND

You'll want to be on deck as we cruise Prince Christian Sund with its impressive peaks and glaciers. Roughly 60 miles long, the waterway is fringed with the creeping glaciers of the Greenland ice sheet and icebergs regularly calve into the sea.

DAYS 9-10: SKJOLDUNGEN FJORD & UMIVIK BAY

Skjoldungen Fjord is another place where you can expect to see tidewater glaciers and perhaps catch sight of a glacier calving. Above, huge crevasses



and freestanding pillars of ice known as seracs are silhouetted against a blue Greenlandic sky. Explore it by Zodiac, watching for marine mammals and getting up close to beautiful blue icebergs. A different landscape awaits in Umivik Bay where, unlike the sheer



cliffs and rugged terrain presented by much of Greenland's coastline, the shores are smooth and the ice sheet flows gently over undulating slopes.

DAYS 11-12: TASIILAQ & AT SEA

This was the first place Vikings landed when they arrived from Iceland, and the way of life here is still quite traditional. Walking around, you may find one of more than 1,000 sled dogs, as well as wooden dog sledges, skin-covered kayaks, and fish air-drying on racks. Spend a day at sea crossing the Denmark Strait to Iceland.

DAY 13: HEIMAEY

Explore the populous seabird colonies of **Heimaey Island,** its vertical sea cliffs home to thousands of Atlantic puffins and other birds. In 1973 a volcanic eruption and lava flow destroyed half the town of Heimaey, earning it the moniker "Pompeii of the North." In an act of desperation, the residents pumped seawater to cool and divert the lava flow, saving their town and livelihood. Visit Eldheimar, a museum built around the remains of one of the homes impacted by the eruption.

DAYS 14-15: AKRANES & REYKJAVÍK

From **Akranes**, immerse yourself in Icelandic scenery on an included expedition to a series of incredible waterfalls, some flowing directly from the adjacent lava fields. Wrap up your expedition with an overnight stay in **Reykjavík.** The northernmost national capital in the world, it is also one of the cleanest, greenest, and safest on Earth.

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The Captain eased Seabourn Venture alongside the pier in the small fishing village of Grundarfjörður around 6:30, and after a sumptuous breakfast, guests split up to explore the area.

- A leisurely drive around the Snæfellsnes Peninsula offered views of old lava fields, black sand beaches, waterfalls, and bird-covered cliffs. Lunch featured locally caught cod along with folk stories about trolls and elves.
- Others traveled to the rim of the volcanic crater Saxhóll, the Vatnshellir lava tube, and some stunning formations by the coast at Djúpalón. Wherever guests went, everyone had fun trying to pronounce the local names.
- In addition to the two tours, 17 very excited guests explored the underwater world in Seabourn Venture's submarines.

17-DAY NORTHWEST COAST EXPLORATION & THE SEA OF CORTEZ

VANCOUVER TO PUNTARENAS | SEP 28, 2023 | SEABOURN VENTURE

DAYS 0-1: VANCOUVER & SEATTLE

Your expedition begins in **Vancouver**, **B.C.**, a city with one of the most idyllic settings in the world, sandwiched between the Pacific Ocean and the snowcapped coastal mountains. Next, in **Seattle**, take in the Emerald City's icons like the Space Needle and Pike Place Market, or soak up some of the Northwest's legendary green beauty with an included excursion to one of the nearby national parks.



DAYS 2-3: FRIDAY HARBOR & AT SEA

When you think of idyllic archipelagos, the Northwest may not leap to mind, but the San Juan Islands are just that. Browse the eclectic boutiques of **Friday Harbor** for gifts made with local



lavender, stop by the Whale Museum to learn about the Salish Sea's resident killer whales, or hear the story of the Pig War of 1859, a non-event that is still celebrated annually on the island.

DAYS 4-5: EUREKA & AT SEA

Eureka is at the heart of the redwood coast, its deep-water harbor once a vital asset to the timber trade. The town retains much of its 19th-century charm. Admire the ornate Victorian buildings and large-scale murals on city streets. During a day at sea on your way down the coast, find answers to all your off-shore navigation questions in the Bow Lounge.

DAYS 6-8: SANTA BARBARA & AT SEA

Picturesque **Santa Barbara**, located on the palm tree-lined "American Riviera," harks back to California's earliest days as a Spanish colony. This is also a city of gardens – some sporting mission-era plants such as pomegranates and prickly pears, others showcasing topiaries, roses, or native California flora.

DAY 9: CABO SAN LUCAS

At the southern tip of Baja lies **Cabo San Lucas,** known affectionately as just Cabo. This is the confluence of the Pacific Ocean, the Sea of Cortez, and the Mexican desert, and it's an exceptionally rich and biodiverse ecosystem. Join your Expedition Team



for an optional kayak or submarine expedition in search of sea lions, sea turtles, and the striking environs found both above and below the surface.





DAY 10: ISLA SAN FRANCISCO & ISLA SAN JOSÉ

Tiny, uninhabited **San Francisco** and **San José** islands are perfect for beachcombing and hikes across the interior, dotted with the world's tallest species of cactus. This is also a great place for snorkeling and scuba diving. Search for sergeant major fish, parrotfish, chocolate chip sea stars, and pencil urchins off the rocky headlands on either side of Isla San Francisco's Half Moon Bay.

DAYS 11-13: LOS ISLOTES & AT SEA

These islets offer great opportunities for spotting California sea lions, both swimming around the rocky shores and sunbathing. Join your Expedition Team on a Zodiac[®] tour to see the many species of birds who nest on or circle above the islets: blue-footed boobies, brown boobies, magnificent frigatebirds, osprey, and brown pelicans, to name a few.

DAYS 14-16: SANTA CRUZ HUATULCO & AT SEA

The pleasing subtropical climate, fine golden sand beaches, and warm waters of **Santa Cruz Huatulco** never disappoint. Huatulco National Park is a coastal UNESCO Biosphere Reserve made up of nine small bays. Snorkel, dive, kayak, or ride a Zodiac along its tropical forests, dry forests, and semi-submerged mangroves. Bring your binoculars to look for shy and elusive sea turtles before departing Mexican waters to Costa Rica.

DAY 17: PUNTARENAS (PUERTO CALDERA)

You've entered a region characterized by great biodiversity, and it's packed with national parks and wildlife preserves. In fact, about one fourth of Costa Rica's land is protected. With an abundance of rainforest, mountain ranges, waterfalls, and gorgeous beaches, this is a beautiful place to say farewell to your ship and head for home or on to further exploration.
